

## Homework Timetable (2020/2021)

### Principles of setting effective homework

- Homework is best used:-
  - to **consolidate** and **practise** knowledge and understanding that has already been formally taught;
  - to **revisit** material that was learnt some time ago in order to help students commit this information to their long term memory.
- Homework needs to be set in such a way that allows students, teachers, and parents to plan effectively for its completion. Too much sporadic setting of homework leads to stress and reduces the quality of what can be achieved.
- Homework becomes an increasingly important part of study as students get older. Increasing the amount set in a manageable way over time helps them to prepare for study beyond school, at A-level and university.

Sixth Form	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students are expected to organise their time effectively and make effective use of their study periods.</li> <li>• A student studying 4 A-level courses can expect a minimum of 16 hours of contact time. They also have a number of study periods and homework/ self-study time.</li> <li>• <b>Simply put students need to plan for at least 6 hours of additional work per subject per week some of which is directed for study periods.</b></li> </ul>					

\*On occasions other subjects in KS3 may set homework, as needs emerge. As these subjects only have one lesson per week this will be more infrequent. If homework is set then it needs to be completed in the "other" slots.
