Day to day tasks

As a fire officer, you will be expected to:

- Organise rotas for workers so they can understand when they are required to be at work.
- Deploy teams to emergency situations.
- Order resources for the teams such as uniform, equipment, servicing for engines.
- Rescue people and animals from burning buildings and accident sites.
- Control and put out fires.
- Deal with bomb alerts and floods.
- Manage chemical or hazardous substance spills.
- Give presentations to schools and community groups.
- Inspect buildings to make sure they meet fire safety regulations.




