Years 7, 8 and 9 Summer Assessments

Dear Parents/Carers,

As we progress into the summer term, we continue to work with our students so that they can achieve their very best. During the summer term, students will sit a series of formal assessments in the subjects they study.

The assessment weeks:

- **Y7** summer assessment window is: Monday 9th May – 23rd May.
- **Y8** summer assessment window is: Monday 23rd May – 13th June.
- **Y9** summer assessment window is: Monday 16th May – 6th June.

The specific date of the lesson(s) that the assessment will take place will be communicated via the class teacher (and it is also on the revision/topic list at the bottom of the page).

So that our students are fully prepared for these assessments and for future success, all subjects have created 'revision/topic lists'. Students can use these to revise the content of the summer term assessments and tap into their previous learning.

Mobile phones and electronic devices, including smart watches, are strictly forbidden. It is essential that these are not brought into any assessment. These should be placed in the student's bag and switched off.
