Auditor

(CEIAG Lead)

Internal and external auditors check organisations' financial records and procedures to make sure they are accurate and efficient. The job includes: examining company accounts, identifying risks to the business, analysing financial data, making recommendations for business improvements.

Qualifications:

- 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and maths
- 3 A levels or equivalent



How to become:

 A university course, an apprenticeship, training with a professional body.

Working hours: Working hours are typically 9am to 5pm **Salary:** Salaries start from £19,000 a year. Salaries can increase with work experience. Experienced auditors could earn £65,000 a year.
