Logging on

On a computer (in school or at home), or on a phone:

1) Open a webpage by using Chrome or any web browser. In the address bar at the top,

type: https://hermitage-systems.nelt.co.uk/

2) When you open the webpage, you will be asked to log in. This is your school email

address and password

- 2) Tap the 'share' icon at the bottom of your phone
- 3) tap 'add to home screen' (this will create an app style shortcut)
- 4) type a name (EASI) and tap the 'add' button









HOW ARE WE SUPPORTING STUDENTS?

- In Year 11, students receive another careers interview.





IT'S JUST THAT SIMPLE!


 In secondary schools, the challenge of improving literacy is fundamental.

- Young people who leave school without good literacy skills are held back at every stage of life. Their outcomes are poorer on almost every measure, from health and wellbeing, to employment and finance.
- Last year, over 120,000 disadvantaged students made the transition from primary to secondary school below the expected standard for reading.

IMPROVING LITERACY IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS, EEF

WHAT CAN I DO?

Top Tips to Support Reading at Home

1 Concentrate on reading quality (it isn't all about reading lots!)



Don't worry too much about the 'what' and 'how' of reading each day. Books are great—but leaflets, comics, recipes and instructions on a webpage can all be great too. Following a recipe to make some cupcakes is valuable reading. Be on the lookout for reading, wherever it is!

2 Ask your child lots of questions



All reading matters. Shared reading is about 'reading with', not just 'reading to' (even for older children). So, ask lots of 'Wh' questions, such as Who? What? When? Where? Why? Try them when talking about books: for example, 'what do you think Harry is feeling?'

Ask your child to make predictions about what they have read



If it is a book, look at the front cover—or the last chapter—and talk about what might happen next. Look for clues in the book and be a reading detective! For example, 'can you see the bear on the front cover? Where do you think he will go?'

Ask your child to summarise what they have read



When you've finished reading, talk about what happened. Acting out the things that happened in the story or describing the big idea of a chapter is really fun and maximises learning. For example, 'can you remember all the things that happened on the bear hunt?'

Ask your child to write about what they have read



Write, or draw pictures, from anything you've read! Big writing and pictures are even more fun. For example, use an old roll of wallpaper to make a treasure map with clues from the stories you've read together.

PUNCTUALITY / ATTENDANCE AT HERMITAGE

Attendance Team

The attendance team are based in the Laurea centre. These are the people who closely monitor and track attendance. Students are acknowledged for having great attendance.

Head of Year Weekly Attendance Focus Group

5 students each week will be targeted for additional support and including parental students who are on the threshold of being a persistent absentee. (Below 90%)

As a school, we will always aim to support parents/carers and students. Where we have concerns about attendance, we will intervene early and maintain regular contact with parents/carers and students

If a student has a current attendance of 88% they will be classed, by legislation, as a persistently absent student. If they attend school for the next 10 consecutive school days, there attendance will be above 90% and they are no longer a persistently absent student.

Any absence **must** be followed, as the student returns to school, by a parental note explaining the absence.

PSHE / Tutor time:

Students are educated on the importance of having good attendance and the impact this can have on outcomes. We know sometimes children can be poorly, therefore we aim to ensure check ins on their first day back to school with either form tutors or a member of the attendance team.

Punctuality-

Punctuality at both the start of the day and to lessons within the school day are monitored. Late detentions are held in the English block for students who are late at the start of the school day. Individual subject teachers and departments will ask students to catch up late minutes.

Students are rewarded for weekly with EASI points for 100% attendance/punctuality.


