Every November, Hermitage Academy comes together to honour those who served and sacrificed in times of conflict. This year, our Wellbeing Garden again provided a beautiful and reflective setting for the ceremony.

The service was led by students who are members of the uniformed services, and our Year 12 student Thomas performed the *Last Post* and *Reveille*, adding a poignant touch to the occasion. Dr Whillis, who serves with the Army Cadets, led our students in the parade and service, with Jasmine (Year 9) proudly carrying the standard.

Wreaths were laid by Jacob H (Year 10) alongside our Student Leaders, who read passages with great respect and composure. At 11am, the entire school community observed two minutes of silence to reflect and remember.

Dr Whillis said: "The students involved in the parade were fantastic as were the Year 7 spectators who were so respectful, especially considering being out in the cold and rain. It was both a pleasure and privilege. I'm so proud of how the school has made sure that the sacrifices of past and present service members (and their families) are recognised. Across school, students helped to decorate the space with colourful poppies, and related activities and discussions around Remembrance Day were held within our World Ready programme.



A crochet garland to remember





Supported by 'Changing Faces', Charlie began fundraising at just 8 years old and has since raised over £23,000 through a series of inspiring sporting challenges. And most recently, Charlie embarked on his '10 Miles for 10 Years' challenge, marking the anniversary of his accident

Charlie's determination, resilience, and compassion has caught the attention of our local MP, Mr. Luke Akehurst, who took a break from Parliament this month to visit Charlie at school, after reading about his fundraising from our very own 'Hermitage Herald'!

Charlie and his parents shared their story with Mr Akehurst, and he offered to support Charlie's efforts by talking in Parliament about the Changing Faces charity and the work Charlie has been doing.
