This month we celebrate the roaring success of our Duke of Edinburgh students, starting with our first ever Gold group. The Gold Award, which requires 12-18 months of commitment across volunteering, physical activity, skills development, a residential experience, and an expedition, is known to equip participants with lifelong skills and boost their confidence.

First to cross the line was Dan O. Despite a challenging start to his DofE journey back in 2022, where after months of learning to ski, practice the drums and support his local community band, Dan had to forfeit his Bronze expedition and therefore his award, due to covid. Not one to be deterred though, he quickly jumped into Silver, helping to build bike trails at Hamsterley forest. Throughout his Gold award, Dan has provided invaluable support to the Hermitage library, supporting Mrs Dixon with the reward shop and other duties, as well as being instrumental in the homework support offered to our younger students.

Next to complete was Hannah, who has completed her skill as a Professional Game Academy player at SAFC. Throughout her journey, Hannah's passion for sports has seen her embedded in the local community, helping young children at Mini Athletics club and supporting Junior Parkrun on a weekly basis. She has also practiced the skills of cooking and photography.

Finally this month, Charlie K secured his Gold, having completed a wide variety of challenges throughout the way. 


#### Homework Heroes - Victorian Britain English Homework




#### Homework Heroes - French Flipped Learning

- Our resident tumbler Finn SP travelled to Telford to take part in the Finals of the English Tumbling Championship in the over 13s male category. Despite having a broken finger, he has returned to the Hermitage with a gold medal and as English Champion in his category. Having qualified earlier in the year to represent the North of England, he travels to Birmingham in July to compete in the GB Finals.
- We congratulate Elliott F, who struck Gold at the Scottish National rowing championships in Strathclyde this month. This makes Elliot Scottish National rowing champion! Elliot raced a part of a double, and also as part of a crew of four, picking up the gold for both. This is an outstanding achievement for Elliott and the rest of his crew, where determination, hard work and resilience are essential qualities for making the podium.
