Job of the week



Physiotherapist

Physiotherapists plan and apply massage, promote, and encourage movement and exercise, use hydrotherapy, electro-therapy and other technological equipment in the treatment of a wide range of injuries, diseases and disabilities in order to assist rehabilitation by developing and restoring body systems.

Qualifications:

One of the most common ways to become a physiotherapist in the UK is to complete an undergraduate degree in physiotherapy. These degrees typically take three years full-time (four years in Scotland) and provide you with a solid foundation in physiotherapy.

Study includes a combination of lectures and practical learning at your universities, and 1,000 hours of placements at various physiotherapy settings.

Tuition fees for BSc degrees are up to £9,250 per year for UK full-time undergraduates (2023-24 academic year). Tuition fees for international students vary.

Working hours: Vary around 34 hours.

Salary: The average salary for a Physiotherapist is £39,000 although the maximum rate is considerably higher depending on experience
